

December 6 Coffee Program – “Wills vs. Trusts – What is the Difference? What is Right for You?” Fletcher H. Rush, Esq. speaker

The presentation - Have you ever wondered about the differences between wills and [trusts](#), or whether you need a trust? There are a lot of myths and misinformation out there on this topic, and your barber or the cashier at Publix, while very nice people, may not be the best source for answers to this question. In this presentation, I will describe the differences between [estate planning](#) tools in my attempt to answer this common question. In speaking about evocable living trusts, I'll be providing some basics about the [probate](#) system in Florida. I have found that many people generally know what a trust is, but most people do not have a good understanding of what a trust can do. Trusts can be complex estate planning tools, and I'll present the various issues that should be considered.
